The 2019 conference was unlike any I've ever attended in that it called me to fully employ the principle of learn, earn and return.

There are several concepts that I took from the conference and have used in my daily interactions with both students and colleagues. I'd like to share one with you!


Persistence was the overarching theme, and this was quite evident from the efforts of our founder, Dr. Abigail Jordan. Being able to witness history unfold—as city officials presented a new plaque with wording that better reflected the tireless efforts of Dr. Jordan—was simply amazing! She was both relentless and persistent about a cause she believed in! My takeaway: how can I be more persistent in being student obsessed? What can I do be more persistent/consistent in my efforts to help motivate students toward course completion?

Since the conference, I have challenged myself to reflect on my current interactions with students and how I can hone my efforts to be more persistent. In my current role, I have the opportunity to help students as they work to complete my course. My challenge is to have more meaningful conversations with students who have not passed the assessment to complete my course. In these conversations, I have been reminding students to persevere to see the greater goal (graduation), as opposed to being task-oriented and solely discussing next steps to preparing for the assessment. My conversations are different now, and so are their results!

Last year's event was my first COD conference, and it was absolutely enriching. I learned so much that I have used in my daily practices, connected with other leaders in higher education, and most importantly, I had the opportunity to give back and impart knowledge into our youth!
